

Locating and Marking Application Guide for Gas Utilities



Main or Service Stubs

- High likelihood need to connect later or due to new construction
- Pinpoint location of connection point where a locator may not provide the needed level of accuracy
- Stubs often get knocked down or covered when their end is above ground

Main or Service Repair Locations

- Higher risk point for future failures, where to look first when there's an issue
- Easily able to identify and map
- Ease of identification using a marker and precise
- Positive location

Main to Service Connection

- Marker clearly defines the location of the facility
- If connection point and premise point can be identified, may improve ability to determine the path of the service line
- Provides a good starting point
- Poor locatability due to ungrounded tracer wire
- Sometimes with a metal meter, if changed to plastic not easily locateable
- High risk point for excavation damage, often most vulnerable location for strikes

Service Valve

- Sometimes paved over, covered with vegetation or snow pack
- Can serve as an aid with emergency response to shut off valves

Main Shutoff Valve

- Aids with emergency response to shut off valves
- Not easily locatable and needs to be located quickly
- Often covered

Main 90 degree Elbows

- Logical point of failure (leak)
- Assists in path marking of critical assets
- Change of direction can make them broadside to the path of the utility, making it vulnerable to being hit

Offsets

- Assists in path marking of critical assets
- Point of interest indicating something has changed
- Fittings present leak potential
- Potential higher risk that an abandoned facility may be present in the straight line

Road Crossings

- Depth of cover confirmation, location of conduit, location accuracy for future road work
- Deep dive markings on each side of road to confirm utility location after bore, find buried or sawed-off conduits
- Identify facility in high congestion, high traffic area
- Identify facility in area of future construction
