
However, direct responsibility for bringing NECA programs to the contractor rests with the NECA Field Service, comprised of four centrally located regional offices—in the eastern, southern, midwestern, and western areas of the United States—each with a staff of trained field representatives

and an executive regional director in charge. Staff at NECA’s national office also works closely with chapter staff to make nationally developed services available through the chapter structure. Thus, NECA’s unique structure—which provides for cooperation among the NECA chapters, regional offices, and the

national headquarters, ensures that the best possible services are made available to the nation’s electrical contractors.
