3M Supplier Responsibility Code Expectations



Applies to all 3M suppliers and Conformance to this Code is required to become or remain a supplier to 3M, anywhere in the world, and for any supplied material or service.



3M's suppliers are required to hold their subcontractors and suppliers accountable to the principles in this Code i.e., disseminate and educate the requirements of this Code to their employees, agents, subcontractors, and suppliers.



Suppliers are required to communicate their conformance status to 3M when requested and to make any necessary improvements to ensure full conformance.



If non-conformance to this Code is detected, 3M will attempt to work with the supplier concerned to correct the situation. We require the supplier to develop a corrective action plan to bring its operations into Code conformance so that supply to 3M can continue. If a supplier does not develop such a plan or fails to implement it, 3M may move to terminate the business relationship.



3M's Right to Audit / Verify



3M reserves the right to assess the supplier's facilities through remote or onsite audits conducted at the supplier's expense. These could include 3M led audit or 3M approved 3rd party led audit.



Supplier must cooperate and make resources/facilities available. The necessary documentation shall be maintained and made available upon request by 3M. This requirement also applies to any third-party employment agencies used by the Facility.



3M requires full transparency during the audit process, accurate and honest disclosure of all documentation and information.



Any forms of bribery, corruption, deception and falsification of records are strictly prohibited

Supplier's Responsibilities



Ensure understanding and alignment of 3M's SRC requirements



Ensure your direct and upstream suppliers understand and align with 3M's SRC requirements. Conduct conformance verification of your suppliers



Support 3M inquiries, assessments, and audits. This includes providing relevant information upon request, making resources/facilities available during an audit and providing full transparency (i.e., accurate and honest disclosure of all documentation and information, full supply chain traceability, etc.)



Conduct an ESG assessment of your own operations/facilities at least every two years to ensure conformance to legal and regulatory requirements and the content of the SRC

3M Conducts Risk Assessments

Al ESG risk screening process using multiple industry recognized risk indicators performed on all prioritized suppliers

Informs 3M's prioritization of supplier self-assessments to be completed



Supplier Completes Self-Assessment

Supplier completes an ESG Self-Assessment Questionnaire (SAQ)

Provides 3M info on strengths, potential gaps and risk level

Input into 3M's annual plan to drive supply chain ESG improvements



Continuous Improvement & Capacity Building Programs

Corrective and Preventative Action Plan (CAPA) to address findings, improve performance

Supplier, Factory capacity building programs and opportunities to support continuous improvements related to:

- Labor
- Health & Safety
- Environment
- Ethics

Validated Assessment Program (VAP)

The RBA Validated Assessment Program (VAP) is the leading standard for onsite compliance verification and effective, shareable assessments conducted by independent, third-party firms.

3rd Party On-Site Audit

On-site audit led by accredited 3rd party audit standard approved by 3M (i.e. RBA or equivalent standard) within the last 24 months

Audit costs are covered by the supplier
